Water Thieves Steal 80,000 Gallons in Australia making Mad Max-Style Fiction Become Reality

Thieves stole about 80,000 gallons of water in a region of Australia that's suffering from one of the worst droughts in the history of the country. And with record-breaking heat it feels like Australia is living in the future. That future, unfortunately, looks a lot like Mad Max.

Police in New South Wales report that a farmer in the small town of Evans Plain had about 80,000 gallons of water stolen from his property. The theft from two enormous storage tanks could have happened at any time between December 9 and December 15, according to authorities.

It's becoming more and more common to see thieves targeting water storage facilities, as climate change continues to devastate Australia as it heads into summer. Just a couple of weeks ago, thieves stole about 6,600 gallons of water, enough to fill about six or seven fire trucks, according to local authorities. All in all, it all feels like something out of a sci-fi dystopia, where water wars are fought to survive. More and more Australians are wondering how long it will take the Prime Minister to get serious about this issue.
